FAMILY VIOLENCE DISCLOSED

Client states that they currently feel safe and don't want to engage in any further support

- Consult with your supervisor regarding organisational policies and procedures
- Do child protection and police need to be contacted?
- Complete a basic safety plan with the client
- Case note the conversation and any concerns
- Ask if it is ok to have ongoing check-ins at appointments

Client is open to exploring support options

Client wants to return home

Client is not safe to return home

Do police need to be called?
